Black Warrior Riverkeeper Opposes the Use of Cypress Mulch

Alabama watchdog organization joins fellow Waterkeeper Alliance groups in national campaign

Birmingham – Today, Black Warrior Riverkeeper is asking its 1,000+ members, 11,000+ supporters on MySpace.com and Facebook.com, and the general public to refrain from buying cypress mulch. The lower part of the Black Warrior River watershed is known for its beautiful and ecologically vital cypress wetlands.

Black Warrior Riverkeeper hopes that gardeners will choose to save our cypress swamps by purchasing mulch made from sustainable resources. The public can help by asking Wal-Mart, Home Depot, Lowe's, and other local stores and businesses that sell, buy, or use cypress mulch to boycott this product.

In this time of drought conditions, mulch will play a vital role in people's gardens and yards. Cypress mulch is being harvested from cypress wetlands which have taken hundreds to thousands of years to grow. There are sustainable alternatives that you can use such as pine bark, pine straw, lawn clippings, and recycled tire chips.
